Finding Peace from the Pit Psalm 13 & Psalm 40:1-3 9/16/2018

"My soul is deeply grieved, to the point of death"

-Matthew 26:38

- -The words of Jesus from Gethsemane echo from many hurting hearts
  - -Sudden Circumstantial Avalanches
  - -Physical or Chemical Anomalies
  - -Spiritual Oppression & Attack
- -Depression & suicide doesn't discriminate
  - -Rich or poor, celebrity or citizen, politician, prisoner, or pastor
    - -Andrew Stoecklein, Inland Hills Church, Chino, CA 8/25/2018
- -Believers often get weary at the weight of the world:
  - -Moses in his frustration with Israel, Elijah in his fear of Jezebel
  - -Paul w/ pressure of ministry, Jeremiah in his pit, David in the Psalms

## Psalm 13:1-6 ESV

How long, O Lord? Will you forget me forever? How long will you hide your face from me? <sup>2</sup> How long must I take counsel in my soul and have sorrow in my heart all the day? How long shall my enemy be exalted over me?

- -Struggling with the weight of waiting for deliverance from the Lord
  - -How long, O Lord?
    - -Feeling as if God has forgotten your cause & cries.
    - -Feeling as if God has withdrawn from you & is unavailable.
    - -Feeling overwhelmed by the echo chamber of your soul.
    - -Feeling frustrated that the enemy has not been brought low.
  - -The closeness of the situation has obstructed his view of God
    - -Dwelling on the depth of the pit does not bring deliverance
- <sup>3</sup> Consider and answer me, O Lord my God; light up my eyes, lest I sleep the sleep of death, <sup>4</sup> lest my enemy say, "I have prevailed over him," lest my foes rejoice because I am shaken.
  - -Recognizing the desperate need for the Lord's deliverance
    - -Cries of defeatism must be replaced with the Cries of dependence
      - -O Lord, My God, I need Your light for my darkened eyes
        - -Lest I sleep in Death
        - -Lest my enemy proclaim victory
        - -Lest my foes rejoice at my fall
    - -Desperation reveals his need for dependence even to depend
- <sup>5</sup> But I have trusted in your steadfast love; my heart shall rejoice in your salvation. <sup>6</sup> I will sing to the Lord, because he has dealt bountifully with me.
  - -Be Reminded of already-established trust in already-demonstrated love
    - -The Reminder comes from the Lord
      - -I have already trusted in your steadfast love
      - -I will rejoice in your salvation (not realized but recognized as sure)
      - -I will sing to the Lord b/c He has already dealt bountifully with me
    - -Remember the Lord's established character for the courage to wait

I waited patiently for the Lord; He inclined to me and heard my cry. <sup>2</sup> He drew me up from the pit of destruction, out of the miry bog, and set my feet upon a rock, making my steps secure. <sup>3</sup> He put a new song in my mouth, a song of praise to our God. Many will see and fear, and put their trust in the Lord.

Psalm 40:1-3 ESV

Wait...The Lord will Respond

-Patiently trust He will hear & incline Himself to you

Wait...The Lord will Rescue

-Patiently trust He will pull you out of the pit of destruction & the mire

Wait...The Lord will Re-establish

-Patiently trust He will give you a firm place to stand

Wait...The Lord will Refresh

-Patiently trust He will inspire fresh praise for His deliverance

Wait...The Lord will Redeem

-Patiently trust He will use the ordeal for His glory among those who see
